LEIGH MATTHEWS AM

‘Lethal Leigh’ – is officially recognised as the “best player of the 20th century”. He is a Legend in the Australian Football Hall of Fame, on the Hawthorn and AFL Teams of the Centuries and is one of the most successful AFL coaches of all time. He is now an AFL commentator on television with the Seven Network and on radio with 3AW.



PEGGY O’NEAL AO

Peggy is the President of the Richmond Football Club and a lawyer by profession. She was born and raised in America and moved to Australia in 1993. She was the first woman elected president of any AFL club. As president she oversaw Richmond’s 2017 premiership win – the club’s first since 1980 and Richmond’s 2019 Grand final win.



PETER HUDSON AM

Peter is one of the greatest full-forwards in AFL history. Over his career, he kicked 1,721 goals in 288 premiership games between 1963 and 1979, and 1981. In a Victorian Football League career beginning with the Hawthorn Football Club in 1967, he kicked 727 goals at an average of 5.64 a game. He won the Coleman Medal for the League’s leading goal kicker four times in his career.



CHELSEA ROFFEY

Chelsea is a journalist and a goal umpire in the Australian Football League. She became the first woman to officiate an AFL Grand Final when she was selected as goal umpire for the 2012 Grand Final. As the only woman to umpire in an AFL Grand Final, and being named Official of the Year by sporting bodies in Queensland and Victoria, her pathway to success is inspirational.



GARETH ANDREWS

Gareth played VFL/AFL football for Geelong and Richmond. He was joint founder of the VFL Players Association and became its second president. He was later CEO of Richmond. Following his playing career, he stayed in AFL Football, firstly as Football Manager and then CEO of the Richmond Football Club before moving to the media. In late 1998 he was elected to the Geelong Football Club Board.

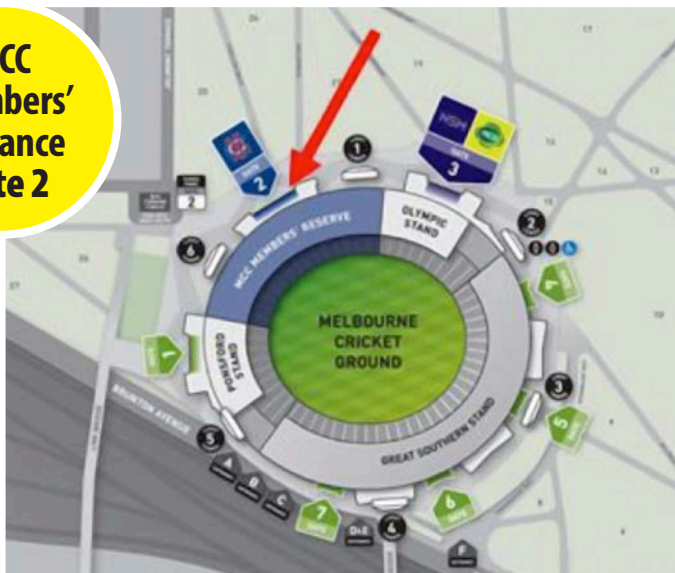

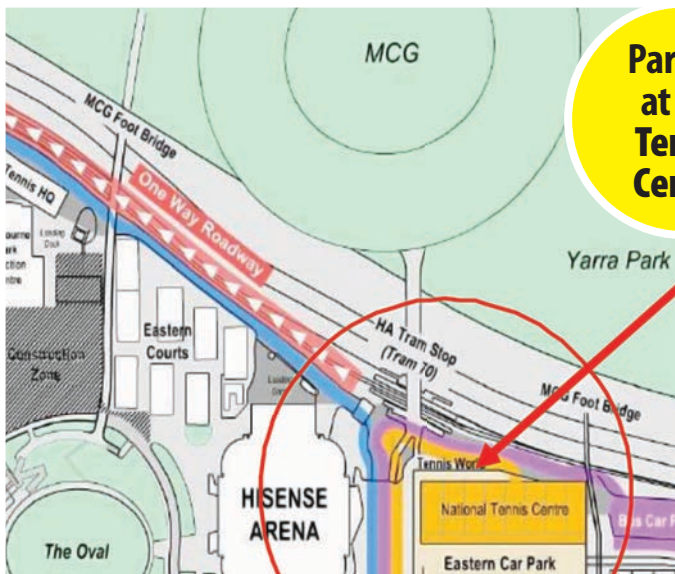
